First Evensong



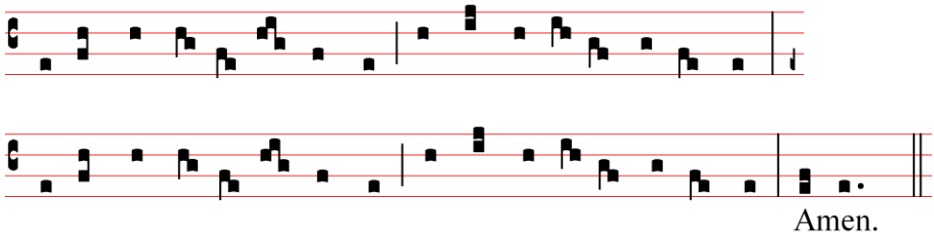
